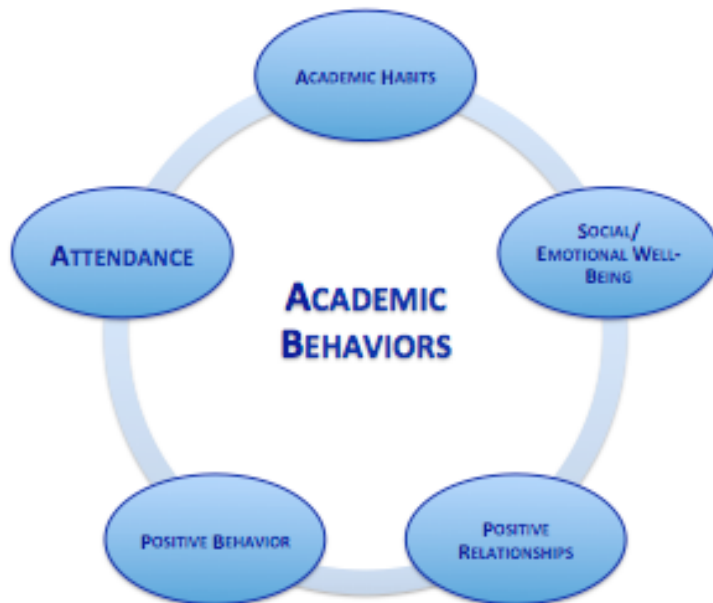

The level of academic achievement that students attain by eighth grade has a larger impact on their college and career readiness than anything that happens academically in high school

Tips for Parents

To Support Academics...

- Stay involved in your child's education.
- Attend parent conferences.
