From the Principal's Desk...

I wanted to give you some information about a few updates which will go into effect for the **2015-2016 school year.**

Policy 8030 - has been updated to include revisions to High School Courses taken in Middle School. Beginning in the 2015-2016 school year, Algebra, Geometry, and World Language courses will count toward the 21 credit requirement. Grades and credits will be reflected on the high school transcript, however, grades earned will NOT calculate into the GPA. If a high school student retakes a course taken in middle school, the high school grade will be calculated into the GPA and only one credit will be awarded.

BYOD - Middle school students will have an option to use their personal devices in class as instructed by the teacher. HCPSS will not mandate that students provide their own technology and students assume full responsibility for their own devices. As is current practice now, if a student is not following the guidelines for use of personally owned devices, an adminstrator can revoke this privilege through the regular discipline process.

Synergy - A new Student Information System (SIS) will be replacing Aspen in August. We will no longer be using the Family Portal. Parents will still be able to use the mobile-friendly benefits of this new program. I will send out more information as well as how to set up accounts when we receive it.
